

COVID Outbreak Contingency Plan St John's CE Primary School September 2021

| When should my child self - isolate or miss school? | NO All children MUST attend school unless they are ill. From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact has tested positive for COVID -19. Instead, they will need to book a PCR but can continue coming to school so long as they do not have symptoms and the result is negative. |
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| | If your child develops COVID symptoms at home, they should stay at home and book a PCR test, not a Lateral Flow test. If your child develops COVID symptoms at school, they will be sent home and should book a PCR test. If your child tests positive for COVID, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated - but should instead book a PCR test. |
