Dear Parent/Carer,

INDUSTRIAL ACTION BY THE NATIONAL EDUCATION UNION

The National Education Union is planning to take further industrial action on Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May over pay, conditions and funding. This is a dispute between NEU members and the government; it is not a dispute with the school or Academy Trust.

The action, will result in class or whole school closures across the country.

The decision to close the school and / or send pupils home is never taken lightly, but in this instance, where staff have elected to take lawful industrial action, I will have no choice but to take appropriate steps to ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of all pupils.

We know that school closures inconvenience parents and carers and so I am writing to give you advance notice of the likely impact of the action on this school. I appreciate the need for parents and carers to be notified at the earliest opportunity so that alternate arrangements can be made for children if they are unable to attend school. Planning is however likely to take some time as rules relating to industrial action mean that we are unable to accurately identify the exact number of staff that are likely to engage in industrial action.

If the action does go ahead, the following arrangements will be in place as things currently stand. Please bear in mind that things are changing rapidly in this respect and plans can change. I will do all I can to update you as soon as possible if necessary.

On Thursday 27th April the following classes will remain open; Nursery, Reception, Year 1, 2, 3 and 4. Year 5 and 6 will not be open.

On Tuesday 2nd May the following classes will remain open; Nursery, Reception, Year 2 and 3. Year 1, 4, 5 and 6 will not be open.

It may be possible that some of these year groups are able to attend on the day but at this time I would ask that you make arrangements for your child to stay at home. We will update you if there are any changes nearer the time. It may not be possible to give you a final update until the day of the industrial action.

We are able to make provision for the children of critical workers (please check the government website if you are unsure whether this includes you), and children with particular vulnerabilities.

If your child was previously invited to attend on strike days please send them to school on 27th April and 2nd May. As before, please bear in mind that your child will not have their normal teacher/teaching assistant on the days concerned.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we deal with the challenges around this situation. I will endeavour to keep you up to date as things develop. Yours sincerely,
